## TWO BOARD DIRECTORS RETIRE

Cedar Rod and Gun Club had two long-time Board of Directors retire. Shari Prevost recently interviewed long time CGRG Member Jim Balesh about his years of CRGC involvement.

This year's St. Patty's Day Shoot on Saturday March 16th was a huge success for the Cedar Rod and Gun Club. March 16th was also long time CRGC member Jim Balesh's 84th birthday. He chose to celebrate with his lifelong friends at the St. Patty's Day Shoot and 2024 Opening Day for the Club. It was here that I surprised him with an interview about his 68 years of membership at the Cedar Rod and Gun

For over 60 years Jim has enjoyed the Cedar area and has always been an avid sportsman. He told me stories of his favorite dogs - a springer spaniel named Cody and a small beagle named Lady. Together, they spent hours in the woods and around the house hunting birds and cottontails. Jim also hunts whitetails deer. His biggest trophy from his homestead on French Road is a 10-point buck. Adventures did not end in the back yard. In the early 70s, one of Jim's most memorable hunts was a self-quided trip to Rifle, Colorado where he bagged a 5x5 Elk and a Mule Deer with a two-foot spread.

One of Jim's earliest memories of the club is when he was asked to pick up the new clubhouse. That is exactly what he did. He drove his truck to Traverse City and picked up a shack up off the beach. The old resort was called Owatakwa on East Bay. His father played in a jazz band at the dancehall onsite. He loaded up the shed and towed it down a dirt road now called Sullivan, to its current location at the club.

In 1988 Jim started his business, Centurian Machine and Tool. He ran this business successfully until he decided to retire when Covid hit. When not at work, Jim kept busy traveling across the country competing in trap shoots. He traveled all over, from Arizona to the East Coast, He

won many awards but in 2016. he was proud to have won the State Michigan of Handicap Trap Competition. When asked about favorite aun. he named quite a few, Ljutik,

Silver Seitz, and currently a Kolar Combo with an interchangeable barrel.

All of this is extremely interesting, however, what makes Jim Balesh most famous at the club is not his many years of membership, leadership as a board member, or his 5 years of being president, continued on page 2

#### **RECIPE**

A couple of months ago the *Leelanau Enterprise* published an interesting article interviewing Doug Whitely, CRGC Member for almost 10 years. I reached out to Doug about some recipes since I'm usually on the lookout for recipes to use game birds. Doug kindly provided the recipe below that Joanne found and they have prepared many times over the years.

The L.L. Bean Game & Fish Cookbook by Cameron & Jones, 1983. P. 164-165

## QUAIL ON A BED OF LEEKS

- 8 quail serves four
- · 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 6-8 leeks, about 2 cups, cut into 1" slices
- 1/3 cup heavy cream
- · Salt & freshly ground pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley

In a large skillet or a wok sauté the quail in 1 tablespoon butter and the oil, browning quickly on all sides. Remove.

Sauté the leeks in the same pan in the remaining butter. Add just a little water to them—no more than 2 tablespoons—cover, and cook slowly for about 10 minutes until the leeks have begun to soften and have absorbed the liquid.

Place the quail on top of the leeks, salt and pepper them, then add the cream all around. Cover and cook slowly for 20 minutes. Sprinkle parsley on top when serving.

#### RIFLE RANGE UPDATE

NOTE, AS A REMINDER TO OUR MEMBERS, AND ALL POTENTIAL MEMBERS, REGARDING LIMITTED USE OF THE RIFLE RANGE: Our skeet range and sporting clays course both extend across our rifle range. The five stand course may be off to the left of the rifle range, but it also sits ahead of the rifle firing line. Occasionally there are some special events that also inhibit the use of the rifle range. PLEASE, save yourself some frustration and check the events calendar for available hours of use before heading out to use the range.

Spring is right around the corner and range use will start picking up as the temperature rises. Typically during winter time the rifle range sees limited use, even though I have noticed a lack of shooters picking up after themselves. Partially because of the snow, but as the snow melts the empty cartridge cases ahead of the shooting benches, along with who knows what, will emerge. Please grab a broom and a shovel, pick it up along with any in and around the benches and place it in the appropriate buckets and trash cans provided. Always sweep up your empty cases and such, and smile while you're doing it because you are on camera.:)~

Please stop leaving your targets up. Used or not, remove your targets and discard accordingly when you are finished. The targets, used or not, need to be taken down and taken care of. Moisture and wind will turn these targets into litter. Remember, we have many visitors to our club that enjoy all the different shooting sports CRGC has to offer. Many who spend time on or about

the rifle range be it rifle shooting, skeet, five stand, and/or sporting clays all cross paths with our rifle range; consequently cleanliness should be very important to all our members. Our spring clean-up day is May 11th. If you have participated in the past then you know how proud we are of the club and can understand why we strive to always keep it in that condition or even better throughout the year. I am also seeing some obvious carelessness happening at the range. It was not intended to replace the 25 yard retaining lumber every season. We just created the 25 yard berm last season and already the box is being punched with holes. It doesn't matter if it was caused by poorly supervised youngsters, careless new shooters, or rusty old shooters, this is not unacceptable. PLEASE pay attention to what you and others around you are doing and keep those shots on target!

Safety first! Each and every one of us, when using the facility, should watch over others who may stray from good safety practices and if you notice such, then for heaven's sake, speak up! No one needs to get hurt. Unfortunately there are gun owners out there who may have never gone through a safety course of any kind or been taught what safe gun handling is. As a gun club all of us should be promoting those practices that have been drummed into our routine over the years and help those who don't know, learn them as well.

REMINDER: Range fee for each guest is a \$5.00 donation per gun and as your guest YOU are responsible for their actions. Targets are provided at \$.50 each or 3 for \$1.00 please deposit the donations in the appropriate donation box.
